

“Of an Ancient Building Rejuvenated” The Restoration of the Old Courthouse

The Old Courthouse, which was also formerly the City Hall, was the first building exclusively dedicated for the use of the government of the District of Columbia. Designed in 1820 by George Hadfield and renovated in 1917, this National Historic Landmark in Judiciary Square has undergone a multi-year rehabilitation to serve as the new home of the District of Columbia Court of Appeals. To celebrate the return of this historic building to one of its traditional functions, the DC Preservation League invites you to tour the Old Courthouse with lead architect and DCPL business member Hany Hassan of Beyer Blinder Belle Architects & Planners, LLP who will discuss its Neoclassical design and the adaptation of a 185-year-old building to twenty-first-century requirements.

The tour will begin in the north plaza (E Street) across from Judiciary Square.
